1. Introduction

Hope for Eternity Ministry (HEM) is a Christian and Charity Organization, established in Uganda on 12 May 2013 by Refugees for Refugees and other vulnerable people. It is a registered NGO by the Uganda NGO Board and signed a memorandum of understanding with the Government of Uganda represented by the Office of the Prime Minister (OPM)-Department of refugees in order to work with refugee settlements. It has its Headquarters in Bukasa-Kizungu/ Wakiso District. Its three programs are Refugee Support and Humanitarian Actions; Community Development Initiatives and Church Leadership Empowerment. The target groups are refugees especially total orphans, elderly, women and the youth.

2.1. Refugee Support and Humanitarian Actions

2.1.1. Assistance to Less than five years orphans and their caregivers



HEM continues its assistance towards less than five years total orphans in Kyaka II and Nakivale Refugee Settlements. By the end of February 2020, the number of 22 total orphans were assisted in Kyaka II Refugee Settlement while in Nakivale Refugee Settlement, 14 were assisted. Services provided to those children include:

- Preparation of caregivers;
- Milk for less than two years old and other malnourished children;
- Porridge;
- Fruits;
- Small fish;
- Soaps;
- Advocacy for medical services;
- Clothes; and
- Playing dollies.



3.1.2. Education Support






